Course Description/Objectives

The TCCC course is the military counterpart to the PHTLS course. It is designed for medics who are preparing to deploy in support of tactical operations.

The specifics of casualty care in the tactical setting will depend on the tactical situation, the injuries sustained by the casualty, the knowledge and skills of the first responder, and the medical equipment at hand. In contrast to a hospital Emergency Department where the patient IS the mission, on the battlefield and in hostile civilian environments, care of casualties sustained is only PART of the mission. During all phases of care, the principal mandate of TCCC is the critical execution of the right intervention at the right time. Casualty care in tactical operations must be the best possible combination of good medicine and good small-unit tactics. TCCC recognizes this fact and structures its guidelines to accomplish three primary goals:
